1. Background

The committee for Asian Computer Networks was set up during the USESCO Workshop on Use of Microcomputers in Educations at Singapore, Feb. 1984.

Several countries requested the connection to CSNET including Japan, Korea and Singapore. CSNET will have the second joint meeting of CSNET - Europe this summer. I talked to Prof. Landweber on the connections to CSNET and the similar joint meeting with the Asian countries. There also is a similar interface on Bitnet between USA and Europe.

Currently, Australia and Korea have the USENET connections which, in turn, connect to CSNET and other networks. Japan is in the process of connections to USENET through KAIST.

Several countries have domestic R & D computer networks. The partial list is as follows;

2. Workshop

The workshops may discuss the following subjects;

- (1) Presentation of national R & D networks.
- (2) Presentation of R & D on networks including LAN's.
- (3) Discussion on establishing Asian computer networks for R & D and education.
- (4) Presentation of CSNET and other networks for R & D and education(Bitnet,...).
- (5) Discussion on the connections to CSNET, Bitnet and other established networks.

The workshop may be held as soon as the time required for preparation is allowed. It may be in October/November or next spring. The funding must be self supported if it must be held this year. Some of the trip and the workshop expenses may be covered by us. The workshop may be based on invitation rather than open. Some of participants are expected to submit a paper and present it. All are expected to participate on the panel discussions.

The following procedure should be followed to distribute PMDF software to sites in your country other than the one which signed the initial PMDF agreement.

In each country, one person should be designated as being responsible for the following. That person should write a letter to Dick Edmiston indicating that:

- you wish to distribute PMDF to other sites in your country
- you will handle the distribution
- you will inform the new sites of and assume responsibility for compliance by the new site with the agreement between you and CSNET which enabled gateway establishment
- such distribution will enable these sites to communicate with CSNET (can of course also be used for local communications)
- you will not distribute the software to any site until you have received a signed license agreement for that site

Send Edmiston a letter with above (with signature so postal mail is necessary). You can then use a license form you have or get a fresh copy from Dick. The Internet is a set of networks that use a common protocol suite, TCP/IP. It includes government-sponsored networks such as the Arpanet and the Milnet, along with other networks that have the permission of the US Department of Defense to connect to these. CSNET's X25Net is one of them. Many corporations, such as Xerox and BBN, have internal networks running TCP/IP that are gatewayed to the Internet.

Because the Internet is controlled by the Defense Department, any organization that wishes to have a direct connection or a legal gateway must have a government sponsor. For CSNET members, the sponsor is the National Science Foundation.

For SDN, I think the only appropriate sponsors would be NSF or an agency of the Defense Department. I sent a copy of your original message to Dr. Lawrence Landweber, who is the international liaison for CSNET. He may know of an alternative. As I said before, CSNET is not in a position to change your service at this time.

NTT is currently working on setting up such a connection. They plan to run IP over X.25, with a gateway to the Internet. Because NTT is an industrial member paying the full dues rate, we are not under the same constraints in their case as we are in yours.
